Teachers can easily monitor student progress and participation through these collaborative tools.



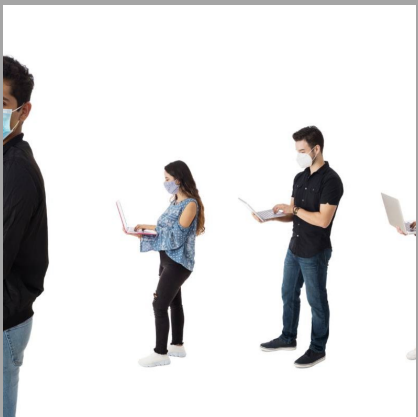
Student Work Sharing
