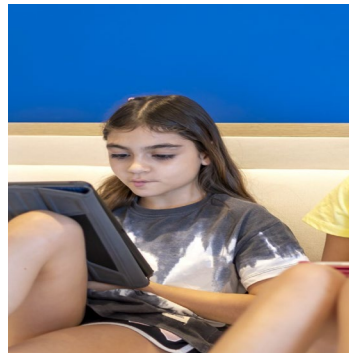
Diverse Assessment Approaches

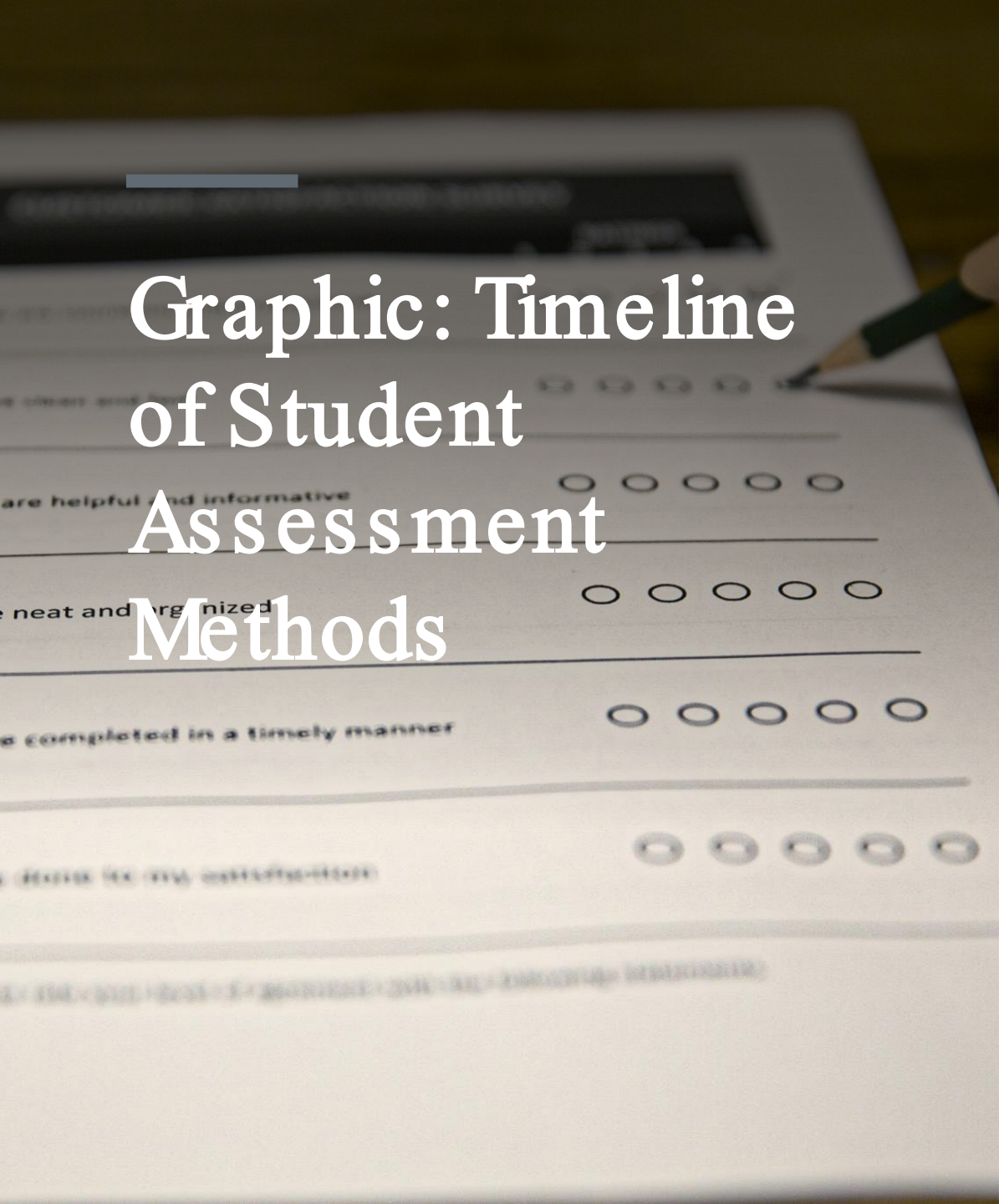

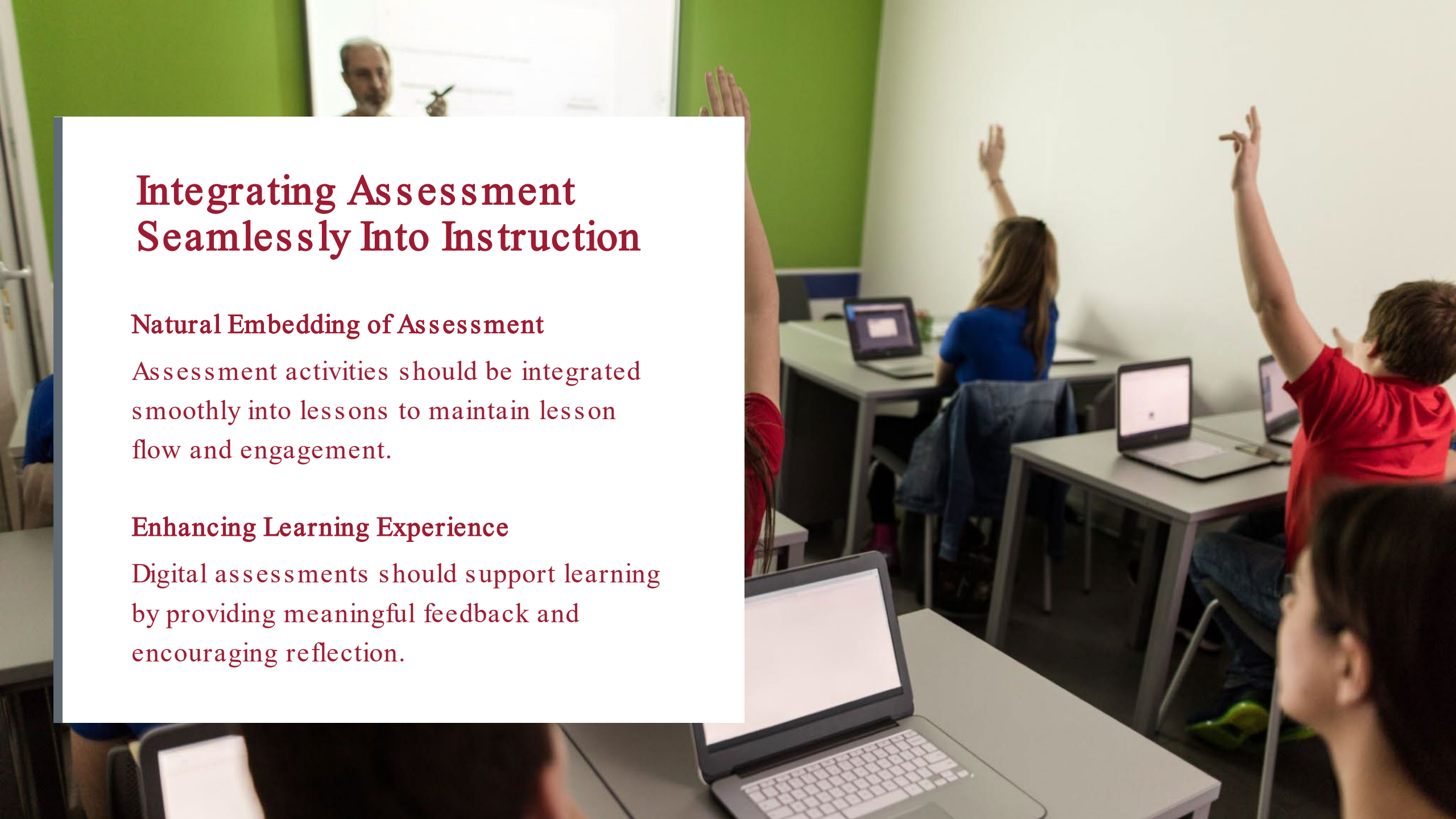

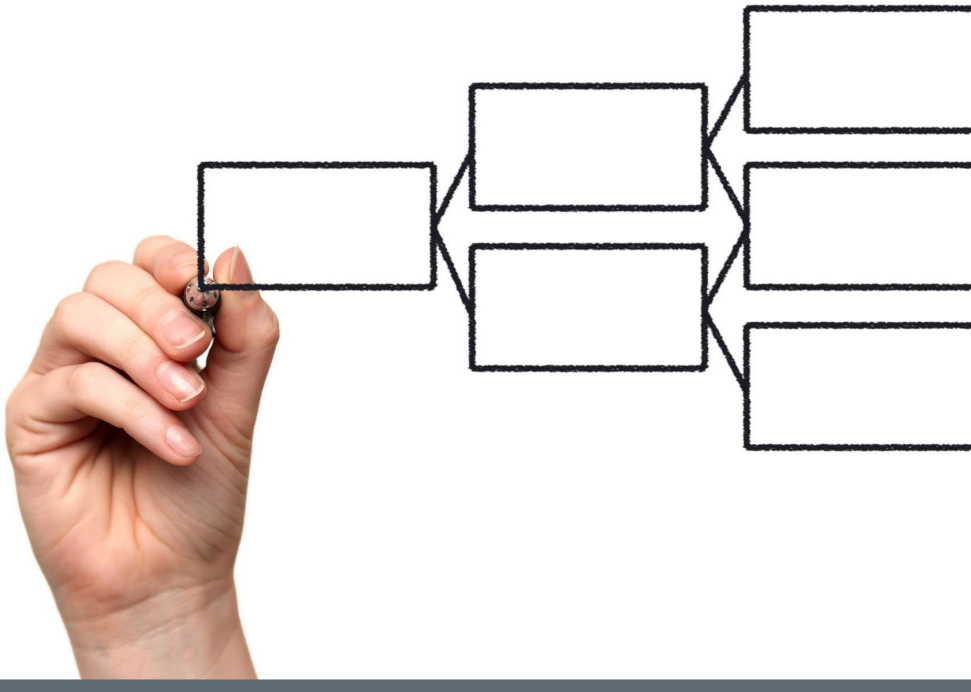
Natural Embedding of Assessment
