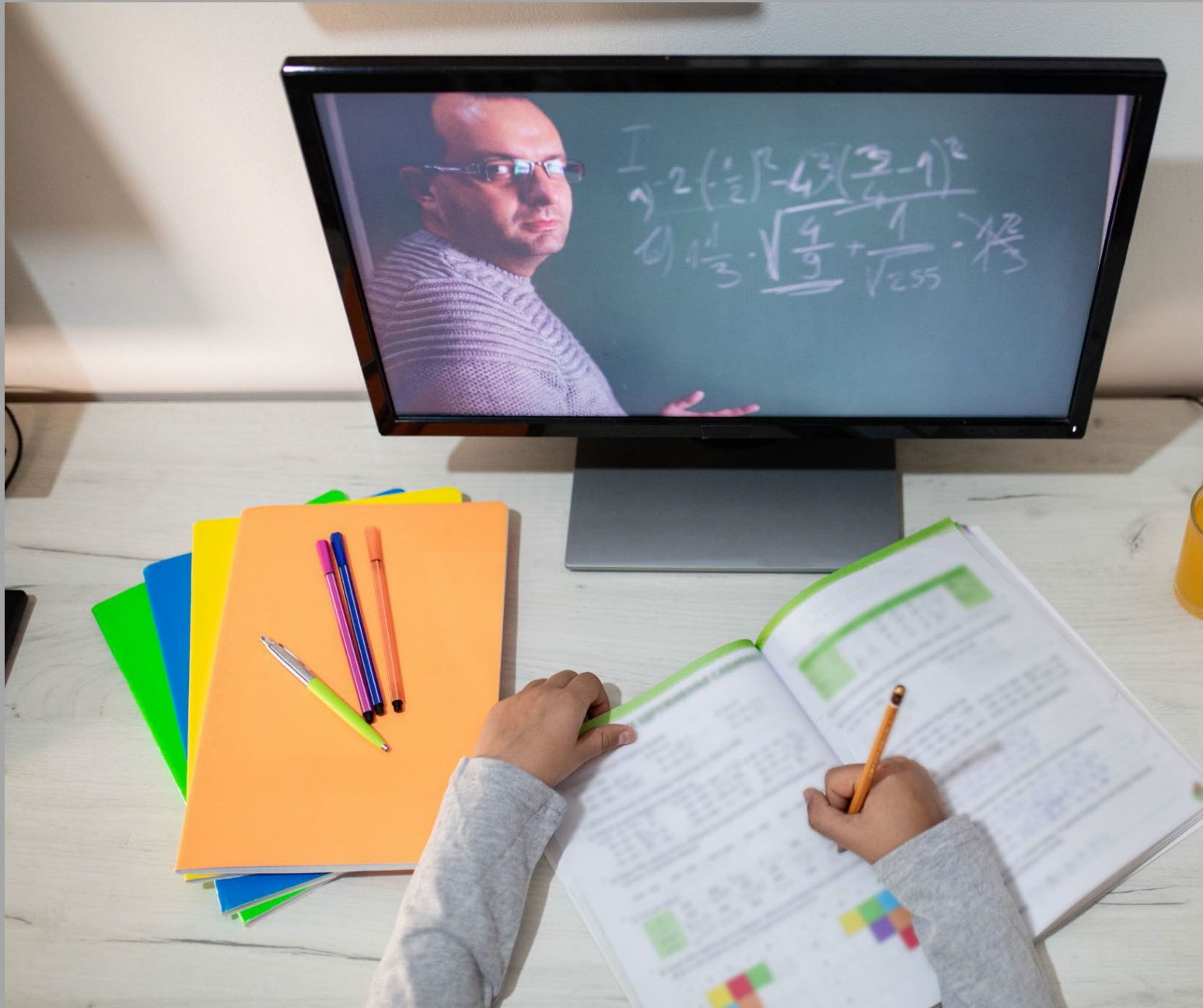

Use of Rubrics

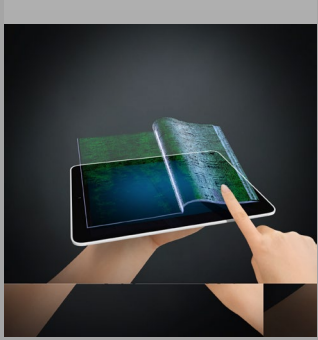
Rubrics provide clear criteria for evaluating content accuracy, creativity, and technical skills in digital storytelling projects.
