Use of Quizzes

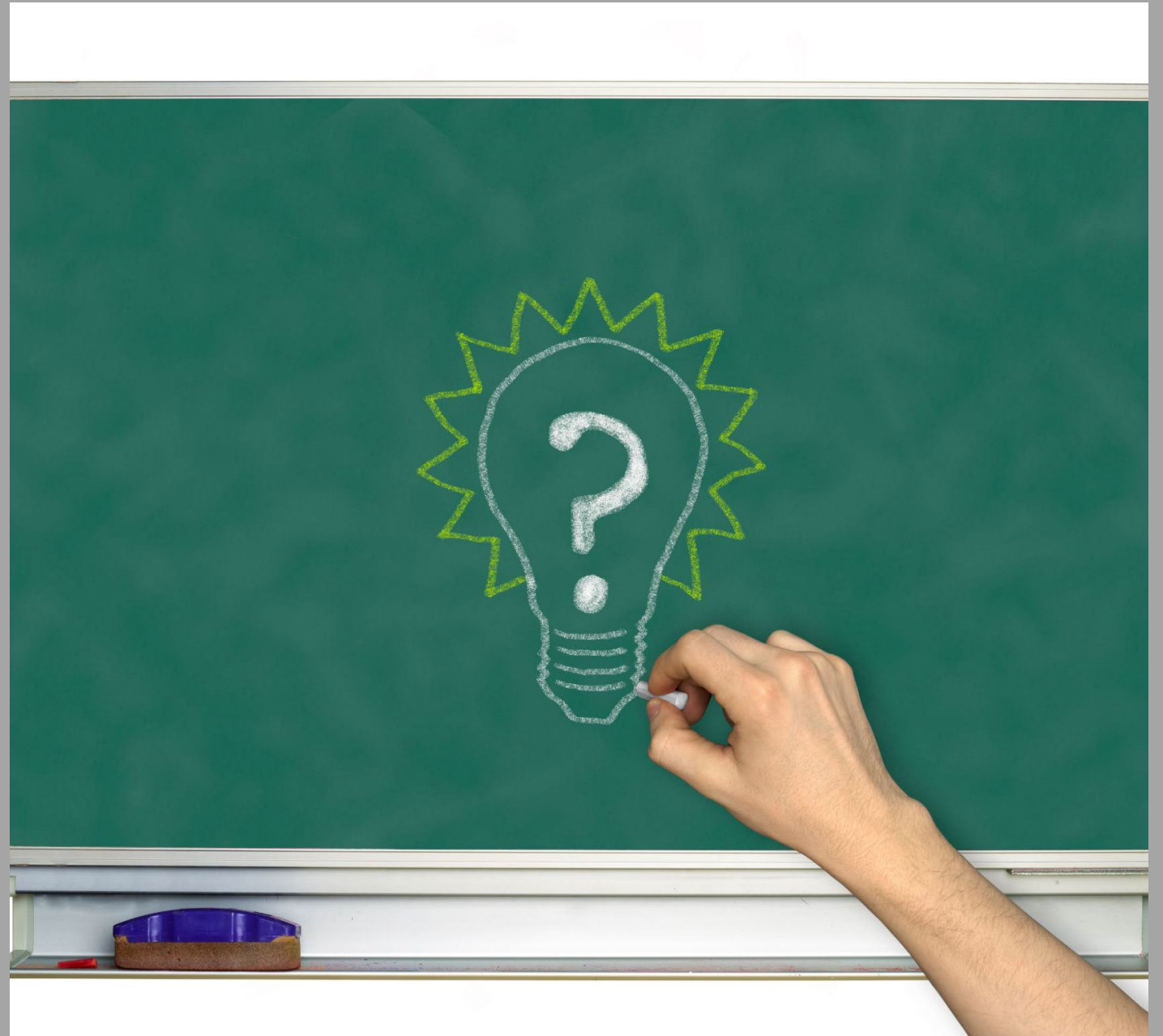
Including quizzes in videos helps reinforce learning and assess student understanding in real time.

Closed Captioning

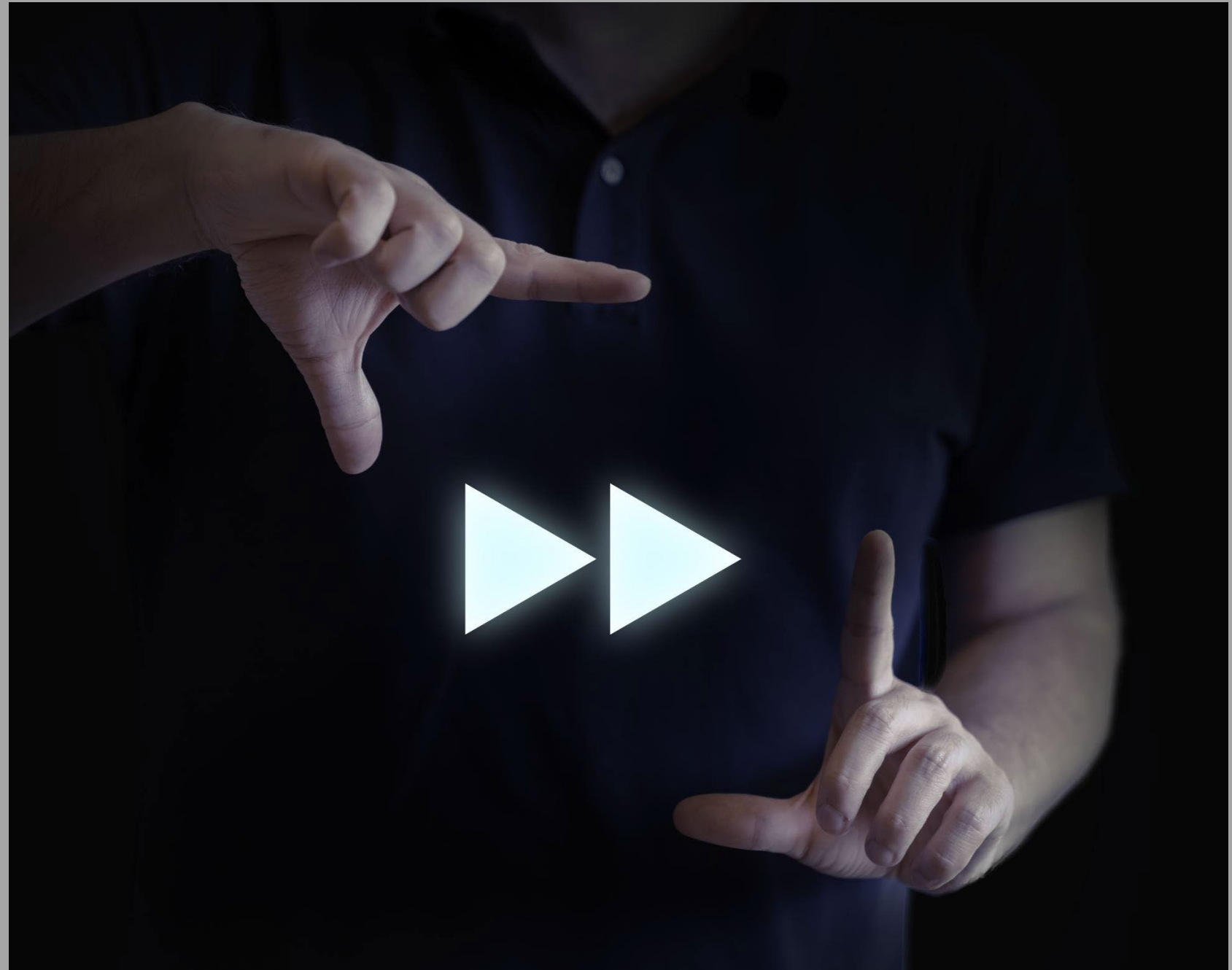
Closed captioning makes video content accessible to students with hearing impairments or language barriers.
