Introduction to Stop-Motion Animation



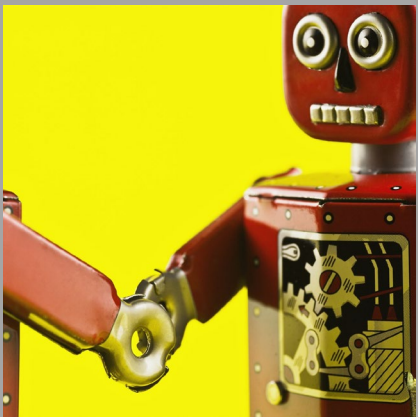
Stop-Motion Animation Defined
